### Town Birthday Party and Train Ride – Saturday evening, August 20<sup>th</sup>

Saturday evening, August 20<sup>th</sup>, the Town of Silver Plume and its friends will celebrate the 142<sup>nd</sup> anniversary of its 1880 incorporation. Meet at the Silver Plume Depot of "The Loop" railroad to board at 5:00 p.m. for a 5:30 p.m. departure. Afterwards, we will gather for a pot luck picnic supper at Dinger's Park. Bring a dish to share and enough place settings for your group or family. We will have hot grills available.

**An important reminder:** There is no alcohol allowed on the train ride and no backpacks. If discovered with alcohol, a passenger will be put off at the Devil's Gate station and not allowed back on the train. Please adhere to these rules so that the train ride can be enjoyed by all. Leave your backpacks in the car and save your drinks for the picnic. The train will have alcoholic beverages available at a discounted price. Masks are optional this year. Watch for posters as the party nears!

The train ride is for town residents (full- and part-time) and People for Silver Plume, Inc. members. An individual membership gives you one ticket for the train ride. Family, Sponsor, Sustaining, Life, and Honorary memberships give each person in your household a free ticket. **Treasurer’s Corner**

Now is the time for the 2022 People for Silver Plume Membership Drive to begin. We are coming out of a difficult fund-raising environment and are hoping that we will have your support as we move forward once again. We have begun the return to a more recognizable fund-raising calendar, with this year’s melodrama and ice cream social. The ice cream social brought in about \$950 and reconnected many friends and neighbors. We are awaiting the report from the Melodrama. Some designated donations have come in for the jail and the bandstand; building rentals brought in about \$1250 since opening up more after CoVid restrictions; and the museum’s income from admissions and sales helps cover its operating costs for the summer season (though it is never quite enough). We count on membership dues to help us meet building maintenance costs for the schoolhouse, former Methodist Church, and Large Town Hall. The PFSP Board is excited about taking this opportunity to renew and rejuvenate our organization. We hope this also serves to excite and engage our community, starting with our members. We can increase DEAI through reassessing Peeps' bylaws and refocusing our commitment to Silver Plume's history through our mission. With the continued support from you we can rebuild our membership and our commitment to the town we love.
